



- Tuition discounts or scholarship opportunities at host institutions


Double Degree Program

Visiting Student Program

 Students from non-partner universities can study at HUFS as fee-paying students for one semester or one academic year while receiving benefits equal to those of exchange students.

Eligibilities

- Enrolled at a partner institution of HUFS (only for exchange students)
- · Completed at least one semester at home university
- GPA: over 2.5 out of 4.0 (equivalent to B average)
- Meet the minimum level of language requirements

(Korean: TOPIK 3 / English: TOEFL 80)
