Who are the courses for?

Courses are designed for **<u>beginners</u>** who have little or no previous knowledge of the language.

Any full-time student of De Montfort University can apply.

Each of the classes have a maximum of 12 places available.

The course will cover the basics of your chosen new language including speaking, reading and writing as well as some homework practice.

What is the cost?
