What is the DMU Global languages offer?

Any full-time fee-paying student of De Montfort University Leicester can enrol to study a language, with 25 places available per class, per term. DMU Global offers 4 different language classes including:

- French
- German
- Japanese
- Spanish

Courses are designed for complete beginners. Ideal for students who have very little or no previous knowledge of the language/Common European Framework A1.

How much do the classes cost?

The 10-week course has a participation fee of £30, the course textbook is **included in the price** (textbook provided in first class).

When do the classes take place?

Classes are 2 hours long and run for 10 weeks in Term 1 and 2, Monday – Thursday between 5-7pm.

Teaching and Learning

Your course will be taught using English and your chosen language and will develop your awareness of **speaking**, **listening**, **reading** and **writing**. Your teachers will also introduce country-specific cultural topics. They will suggest independent online activities as well as post suggestions/links via Learning Zone, to help your progress.

General course aims

- Enhance your language skills (both native and foreign)
- Provide opportunities to study, work, live and travel the world
- Improve your employability
- Give an appreciation of new cultures, societies and arts
- Sharpen your personal and transferable skills

Following completion of a 10-week A1 level course, students should be able to understand and use familiar everyday expressions and very basic phrases to communicate and exchange information in a simple way.

Homework and attendance

The contact teaching time is supported by weekly homework and online activities provided by your teachers. Please do make sure you complete these tasks to ensure the smooth running of the following session and to make the most of contact time with your tutor.

Attendance in class is an essential part of learning. The constant, ongoing language contact, including the variety of interactive class activities, will provide you with the most effective progress at this level.

You are expected to attend ALL of your classes and require at least 80% attendance in order to receive formal recognition for completing the course. Classes will close if numbers fall below 10 for 3 consecutive weeks.

Recognition

On completion of your language class, you will be issued with a **DMU Global Language Course Beginner Level Digital Badge** via our badge issuing platform Badgr. Once you have claimed it, you can save it to your 'digital backpack', publish it to you LinkedIn profile or even download a certificate version.
