

SUMMARY

DMU Global successfully delivered a whole year of international experiences for DMU students. An overwhelming 96% of participants would recommend our opportunities to their fellow students.

Thanks to enhanced support for students and staff, coupled with various innovations and a commitment to providing accessible experiences for all, we saw an impressive 1,250 students take part in our opportunities during 2022-23.

A significant 91% of participants believe that international experiences are a crucial aspect of their time at DMU. These students are keen on exploring new overseas opportunities, developing their intercultural skills, and building networks. Here are some of the main takeaways from their feedback:

As a result of participating, students not only **met new people**, but also felt a **stronger connection to the university**. 







STUDENT EXCHANGE

Every year DMU Global offers students the chance to spend a year studying or working abroad as part of their degree, with the experience part-funded by the Erasmus+ programme and Turing Scheme.

In 2022-23, 49 DMU students spent the year studying (41) or working (8) overseas.

Complementing our overseas activity, DMU Global continued to offer a combination of virtual and on-campus international activities to students throughout the 2022-23 academic year.





- > Languages: 169 students studied languages including: Arabic (13), French (37), German (27), Japanese (47), and Spanish (45).
- Mandarin: 169 students studied with the Confucius Institute.
- Intercultural Awareness Course: 16 students participated in the DMU Global Intercultural Awareness Certificate.



- Virtual exchanges: 74 students engaged in various programmes and activities in cooperation with university partners globally.
- Global Citizenship Programme: 32 students participated in a programme exploring global citizenship and UN SDGs.
- Teach English as a Foreign Language (TEFL): 96 students participated in a TEFL online course to help them learn how to teach English to non-native speakers.



SECTOR ENGAGEMENT AND SUCCESSES

We have always seen DMU Global as a sector lead in the field of internationalisation, and over the past year we have continued to share our expertise with colleagues globally, whilst actively participating in networks, evidenced by the following...

- Presenting a session to the international mobility community at the British Universities Transnational Exchange annual conference in Birmingham in summer 2023, with a focus on utilising Turing funding to support short-term mobility opportunities for students.
- Active participation in the International Network of Universities of which DMU is a member alongside 12 universities globally. We were represented at Council meetings in Stellenbosch and Hiroshima with our students travelling to Japan alongside staff to participate in the Global Peace Seminar in August 2023.
- Representation at global conferences including NAFSA 2023 in Washington D.C, and EAIE 2023 in Rotterdam, whereby our team were able to meet with our network of global partners and create new links, opening up future opportunities for our students.
- Beginning the process of become an active signatory to the Climate Action Network for International Educators (CANIE) Accord. CANIE is a grassroots initiative formed by international education practitioners from around the world who see the need for our sector to step up and act on climate, focussing on the importance of virtual and on-campus internationalisation as an alternative way of achieving intercultural learning.

National recognition

DMU Global was also recognised nationally for our work related to improving student employability and responding to the climate crisis.



Winner: Building Back Better

In November 2022, DMU Global won a Green Gown Award in the Building Back Better category. DMU Global was recognised for its innovative response to the COVID-19 pandemic and climate crisis, which includes attempts to reduce our carbon footprint, educate students and staff about sustainability, and the introduction of 'greener' virtual international experiences that encourage meaningful online collaboration with partners and students globally.



Highly Commended Finalist

In September 2023, DMU Global and the DMU Careers Team were recognised as a Highly Commended finalist by the Professionals in International Education (PIE) for their Employability International Impact award as part of The PIEoneer Awards 2023. The PIE recognised the collaboration for its meaningful short-term overseas experiences that are focused on fostering entrepreneurial spirit and making students more employable.



LOOKING AHEAD

Our planning cycles within DMU Global always mean that by the time this annual report is published, work is already well and truly underway to deliver the 2023-24 programme of activity. Our overarching aims for the year are to increase student participation in overseas opportunities, broaden the scope and scale of our Turing Scheme funded activities and to improve our reporting of the impact of international experiences on our students.

It is also worth noting that 2023-24 will be the **10-year anniversary of DMU Global**, and over the year we will look to showcase the journey we have been on, whilst sharing student and staff stories about their experience of the programme through the years.

Some of our key strategic objectives for the upcoming year are to:

- Deliver an increased number and range of academic and extracurricular overseas experiences for DMU students that enhance studies, and support the development of a range of key skills valued by employers.
- Grow and diversify the range and scope of opportunities for students to study or work abroad as part of the Turing Scheme, and build meaningful relationships with strategic global partner universities to deliver these experiences.
- Develop the cultural awareness and language skills of DMU students to support them in succeeding in global environments, through the delivery of a range of inclusive and low-cost campusbased and online international experiences.
- Establish DMU Global as a leader in response to the climate crisis in international education, launching a range of new initiatives and projects to improve the sustainability of the programme.
