

## What is the Intercultural Competence Course?

The **Intercultural Competence Course** at DMU Global is an exciting opportunity for you to engage in international themes right on campus. This course helps you build the knowledge, skills, and values you need to become an informed and responsible global citizen.

By joining this course, you'll learn about intercultural communication and the relationships between different cultures. You'll gain insights into various theories and personal experiences, helping you develop empathy, a sense of social responsibility, and awareness of cultural differences. These skills are valuable in today's global job market and can boost your employability in various sectors.

The course includes a mix of on-campus and online workshops. To get the most out of it, you'll need to participate actively, complete any assigned readings, and engage in coursework. You'll need to attend at least 80% of the sessions to earn your digital badge at the end.

## **Course Aims**

The main goals of the Intercultural Competence Course are to:

- Understand intercultural communication: Learn the basics of effective communication and the skills needed for positive interactions across cultures.
- Appreciate diversity: Interact with people from different backgrounds to foster respect for their cultures.
- Enhance communication skills: Gain practical skills to communicate confidently with others from diverse cultures in everyday situations.
- Embrace different values: Learn to accept and appreciate the values and beliefs of others.
- **Develop self-awareness:** Reflect on your own behaviours and how they change in different cultural settings.
- Boost employability: Improve your soft skills like teamwork, resilience, and communication, which employers value.
- Recognise bias: Become aware of stereotypes and biases in society.
- Value inclusivity: Strengthen your appreciation for diversity and inclusion.
