Undergraduate academic calendar

- Autumn semester /full academic year students are required to arrive on **Monday 21 September 2026**.
- Spring Semester only students are required to arrive on **Monday 8 February 2027**.

Language of Instruction (English)

- Applicants should be at 6.0 IELTS standard (with a minimum score of 5.5 for each skill).
- Students coming for one semester are able to provide a signed letter from the home institution indicating proficiency according to a minimum level of CEFR B2.
- Students coming on exchange for a full academic year will need to demonstrate proficiency through an official test.

Teaching model

DMU delivers undergraduate programmes in a Block Teaching format. This consists of studying one block (module) worth 30 credits (15 ECTS) at a time. Two blocks will be delivered per semester. Some exceptions may apply.
