




## Welcome to Osnabrück University!

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## 2026 International Summer Schools in Germany

Introduction to German Language and Culture  
July 12 – August 1, 2026





## International Summer School on »German Language and Culture« (GLC),

**July 12 – August 1, 2026**

This Summer School offers participants with no or little prior knowledge of the German language the opportunity to acquire or build upon foundations of German and to experience more than 1000 years of German culture and civilization in and around the city of Osnabrück, the City of Peace. By the end of the program, students will have mastered basic language skills in German equivalent to level A1.1 or A.1.2 of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

The programme is a cooperation between the Language Center (Sprachenzentrum) and the International Office at Osnabrück University.

### We offer

- one of two courses on either level A1.1 or level A1.2
- an interactive lesson design and small group learning
- hands-on language practice during leisure activities with student partners from Osnabrück University
- a rich cultural and recreational program plus an optional 3-day trip to Berlin
- certification of up to 5 ECTS credits points at proficiency level A1 of the CEFR upon successful completion of the language course

### Program

Throughout the three weeks, the language course will train all four language skills (speaking, listening, reading and writing) and will cover grammar and lexis necessary to:

#### A1.1

- introduce yourself and others,
- talk about your family and friends,
- go shopping,
- express culinary preferences,
- describe your room,
- tell the time,
- inform others about your daily schedule,
- talk about the weather and the seasons,
- describe what you do in your spare time,
- provide details about your personal interests.

Assessment will be in the form of project work, an interactive oral and a pen-and-paper exam at the end of the course.

#### A1.2

- talk about jobs and professions,
- request information by telephone and email,
- check into a hotel,
- give and understand directions,
- schedule appointments,
- talk about your body and express pain,
- ask politely for assistance,
- talk about clothing and style,
- express preference,
- extend and accept invitations.

### Eligibility

Undergraduate and graduate students from all over the world interested in learning German are welcome to apply. If you wish to participate in the A1.1 course, no prior knowledge of German is required. If you wish to participate in the A1.2 course, you are required to have mastered the skills outlined on the previous page. Participants must be over the age of 18.



### Program Fee

We aim to offer you a hassle-free experience. Except for your personal living expenses and travel costs, all essentials are included in the program fee. Specifically, the fee of **EUR 1,400** includes

- All language classes, tutorial sessions and learning materials
- Accommodation,
- All cultural activities and excursions,
- Summer School ID enabling you to eat at Osnabrück University's canteens for reduced prices,
- Bus pass valid for public transportation in Osnabrück,
- Free internet access through Osnabrück University's networks,
- Welcome package with information brochures, emergency information and a few extra goodies,
- Pick-up service from the train station,
- 24/7 assistance via cell phone.

Students from Osnabrück University's partner universities are eligible for a **EUR 250** discount for a total course fee of **EUR 1,150**!

### Accommodation

Osnabrück University's International Office will arrange for your accommodation. You will stay in a single room in either a dormitory or a carefully selected homestay.

### Cultural Program Highlights

As part of this summer school, you will

- be invited to welcome and farewell dinners as well as other social outings,
- get the opportunity to experience German customs and cuisine first-hand through our International Face Time program,
- dive into Osnabrück's medieval history during a guided tour by a night watchman,
- explore Bremen and Bremerhaven's maritime flair as part of our excursion to the Northern Sea,
- learn the history of art and resistance during the Third Reich by visiting an exhibition in the Felix-Nussbaum-Haus,
- trace the origins of Erich-Maria-Remarque's All Quiet on the Western Front,
- gain first-hand experience about the nation's history and current politics during an optional 3-day excursion to Berlin at the end of the program (travel, public transportation, accommodation & breakfast, cultural program all included in the additional fee of **EUR 350**).
